No club will be allowed to compete if full payment of entry fees has not been received by the closing date.

We will also accept mixed club teams; we hope this will encourage smaller clubs to join with bigger clubs to form teams or for those with only 3 riders to find a 4th person.

Eligibility

Area 1 & 22 competitors entering Area Qualifier, eligibility will be as per BRC Rule Book 2026

All non-qualifiers –

60cms Horse & Rider Combination not to have competed at 80cms in current or previous year.

70cms – Horse & Rider Combination not to have competed in 90cms in current or previous year

80cms Horse & Rider Combination not to have competed in 100cms in current or previous years

90cms & 100cms – Open

RULES.

1. All rules relating to each discipline can be found in the 2026 British Riding Clubs Official Rule Book with the exception of any rules herein referred to.
2. All Entries on Equus <https://brcarea22.equusorganiser.com/>
3. Closing date is 17th May 2026 and no intimation of entries by email will be accepted.
4. Late entries will only be accepted if space permits and will incur a late entry fee of £40/team and £10/individual. This rule will be strictly adhered to as there are a limited number of entries for the Cross Country.
5. All entrants must be paid up registered members with BRC HQ or of their respective unaffiliated club a minimum of 7 days prior to competition.
6. Flu vaccinations must be up to date as spot checks may be made on competitors. If you don't have your flu vaccination certificate with you, you will be turned away from the competition which could result in the elimination of your team. Team managers are encouraged to check flu vaccinations are up to date prior to entering.
7. All care will be taken to ensure that times allocated are reasonable if taking part in more than one discipline. It is the Club's responsibility to ensure that any clashes are resolved 7 days prior to the date of the Championships.

AS THIS IS A MULTI DISCIPLINE COMPETITION AND IF YOU ARE RIDING MORE THAN ONE HORSE WHICH RESULTS IN UNAVOIDABLE TIME CLASHES, THEN IT WILL BE UP TO INDIVIDUAL COMPETITORS TO DECIDE ON WHICH CLASS THEY WILL COMPETE IN.

Please note that changes to times will not be allowed just because the time is inconvenient to the rider!

If a horse or rider has to withdraw through injury or illness and a replacement is required, it must be a direct swap into the same class.

8. Competitors who are also taking part in the Horse Trials on the Sunday should be restricted to what classes they can compete in on the Saturday. Team Managers are responsible to ensure competitors are not entered in an unhealthy number of classes.
9. Horses may enter more than one level of Dressage as long as it is consecutive levels, i.e., Intro & Prelim, Novice & Elementary. Horses are not allowed to enter both levels of Riding Test, irrespective of rider.
Horses may enter more than one level of Show Jumping as long as it is consecutive heights, i.e., 70cm & 80cm, 90cm & 100cm.
10. Whips are allowed for the dressage and Horse Trials dressage. All whips for Show Jumping and Cross Country must be as per BRC rule
11. Commanders are allowed for Dressage on both days

12. **Refund Policy.** Refunds will be given up to the closing date of 17th May 26 less 25% admin fee

After the closing date the following will apply

If there is a genuine reason for horse or rider having to withdraw due to illness or veterinary diagnosis, then the rider must present a doctor's certificate or a veterinary certificate detailing the reason why the withdrawal had to be made. In the case of a refund being made a 25% administration fee will be deducted from the entry fee.

Refund policy only applies to individual entries and not team entries. Team entry is a set fee, and no portion of that fee is allocated to individuals.

Refunds will be made to the Club and not the individual.

13. There will be no tack steward for the dressage and show jumping classes, but tack will be visually checked for the XC. It is the responsibility of the rider and their Team Manager to ensure that riders and horses have the correct tack. All hats MUST be visibly tagged.

14. All hats must be tagged in accordance with BRC rules and for XC, back protectors must be worn. Sleeved tops are required, and sleeveless tops are not permitted. It is up to the individual competitor to ensure that all tack and equipment is up to standard **as organisers will not be held responsible for injury resulting from defective equipment or equipment not up to current standards.**

15. The Secretary will only deal with Team Managers and no individual rider so if you have a matter you wish to discuss please speak to your Team Manager. A copy of guidelines for Team Manager's will be sent. Clubs are responsible for ensuring their competitors know who their Team Manager is. **Please ensure that all your members know that the Secretary will not deal with individual riders.**

16. Number template will be emailed to Team Managers Number Bibs should be worn for all phases.

17. Any objection must be lodged with a £50 deposit with the Secretary and if objection upheld, deposit will be returned.

18. Stabling will be open from 3 pm on Friday 5th June Friday night stables only must be vacated by 2.00 pm and entry for Saturday night stables not available before 3.00 pm.

19. **Cost of stabling £60/first night or only night and £30 for subsequent nights. There are ample stables on site. Please note that once stables are booked, no refund will be made as we are charged for the number of stables ordered.**

20. **It is the responsibility of clubs to ensure that they notify the organisers of any stable changes.**

21. **Only straw will be provided, anyone wishing to use shavings must bring their own.**

22. Should anyone require stabling on Sunday night please contact the organisers

23. It is a condition of the entry that all Clubs provide helpers. These can be split into half day shift or a club can nominate to cover a set time period,(eg, Findon will cover Dressage 8:30am – 12,30pm and will provide all help required for that shift.) If no helper names are given then the entry will not be accepted. This rule will be strictly adhered to.

24. All dogs must be kept on short leads at all times. Extendable and retractable leads for dogs are banned from use at the venue. Owners of loose dogs will be fined the sum of £50 on the spot.

25. Please ensure that all dog litter is picked up and this includes the Stable area.

26. Please ensure that children are supervised at all time

27. Please dispose of all litter in the bins/skip provided. Do not put broken tents/chairs etc in the skip – **Take them home to dispose off**

28. Your Personal Information

Personal information that you supply to us may be used in a number of ways to facilitate your riding club membership. It should be noted that as we are affiliated to the British Horse Society as a British Riding Club, your personal information will be shared with them in order to fulfil your BRC membership benefits and they may share with associates for the purpose of fulfilling your full membership benefits i.e. insurance providers.

We / BRC will automatically contact you about your membership: for example, to ensure you receive your membership benefits, to tell you about news, activities and events. This includes sending you a regular magazine, email updates, information on other membership benefits, and publishing competition times and results in the public domain

Balloting policy (if required)

In the event of an over subscription of entries then the following balloting system will be put in place:

- Every Club will have the opportunity to ensure that they have at least one team in each discipline. In the event of a club not being able to field a full team then that club will be allowed 2 individuals representing them in each discipline. This is subject to Clubs fulfilling the criteria of having nominated volunteers to help at the Championships.
- If after the first ballot there is still capacity for further entries then all team names will be placed in a ballot box and drawn in order to fill the remaining team places. All other teams will be placed on a wait list.
- If space still permits, then individual entries will be accepted.

Netherton/BHS Style Jumping Qualifier Information

The course will have 8 to 12 obstacles

maximum height 85cms with a maximum spread of 90cms.

There will be one double.

The optimum speed is 325mpm

Aims & Objectives

- *To encourage better pace & rhythm in competitions & improve rider training in jumping competitions*
- *To demonstrate the rider's knowledge & effect of developing the canter at 325 meters per minute and it's amenability for riding a course*
- *That judges can provide good constructive comments for the benefit of the competitors*

Time

- To be ridden at 325mpm
- The measurement of the course should be generous
- To encourage riders to ride forward, demonstrating the ability to ride positively in pace maintaining balance & rhythm
- The course should be well spread about the arena with 8 – 12 fences
- This should include a stile or narrow fence with at least one dog leg and include a double, which must be built with a spread in & upright out

Judging

- The judge will watch the rider continuously and give marks for position before the round & an assessment of how the course is jumped
- The assistant will note down the assessment of rider before the round mark on the score sheet as well as any jumping penalties incurred
- After competition of the round the judge will award marks for:
 - The rider's equestrian feel & skill
 - The riders leg position, balance & ability to follow the horse's movement over the fences
 - The horses balance & rhythm
- Particular attention will be paid to the development of a 325mpm canter, it's rhythm & balance throughout the round.
- In case of equality of marks, jumping penalties will decide, then in order the riders equestrian feel & skill, the horses balance & rhythm and the riders leg position, balance & ability to follow the horse over the fence
- On entering the ring, the rider should commence in canter and wait for the signal to begin jumping. The round will end when the horse & rider pass through the finish
- There is no need to salute the judge
