Body Protectors - are not obligatory for dressage or show jumping competitions. However, if worn they must be up to current standard (the BETA 2018 Blue Label is the only recognised standard for Body Protectors at BRC events).

ALL Team members will automatically be entered as Individuals.

Mixed Teams - seniors and/or juniors. Teams may be any combination of seniors and/or juniors.

Netherton Equestrian / BHS Scotland Riding Club Style Jumping Qualifier - Course max 85 cm. Open to horses 4 yo and over, not to have any BE points and not to have completed at BE100 or above in the current or previous calendar year. Riders 18 yo on 1 Jan 2025. Run under BRC rules. To be eligible to compete at the final riders must be a senior member of a riding club affiliated to BRC. More details on Area 1 website.

Qualifier Classes: Option 2 - Each team will jump two rounds (with the second round being split into two parts - part one being the second round and part two will be the individual jump-off). The lowest 3 team scores in the first round and the lowest 3 team scores in part one of the second round will be added together to give the team total. If a team member is eliminated or gains in excess of 24 jumping penalties in the first round, they are not permitted to compete in the second round. *BRC Rule Book 2025 - page 55, Option 2.*

Open (non-qualifier) classes - Riders achieving a clear round go straight into a timed second round (jump off). Combinations may enter up to two consecutive height classes.

Open (non-qualifying classes) competitors must be members of an affiliated British Riding Club, OR a Pony Club member, OR a BHS Gold Member, or hold their own public liability insurance.

Area 1 Qualifier - ENTRY RULES

This competition will be run under BRC Rules. Anyone in attendance will be bound by the BRC Code of Conduct. It is important that all competitors are aware of the rules relating to this competition - please see the current BRC Handbook and also the BRC Rule Amendments and Changes Document, which can be found at this link: https://www.bhs.org.uk/british-riding-clubs/brc-handbook/

If the date of the qualifier is cancelled for any reason and re-scheduled within 21 days, the close of pre-entry will remain. If the qualifier is rescheduled for more than 21 days after the original date, entries will re-open. Late entry fees will not be refunded. Eligibility is taken from the Friday before the qualifier, regardless of re-scheduling. Pre-entries that cannot attend the new date may be issued with a credit note but the Team Manager must inform the office in writing before the cut-off date which the Area will be informed about when re-scheduling.

Entry Fees, withdrawals and cancellation due to circumstances beyond our control. In the event of abandonment entry fees will be returned less and administration fee of £10 per entry. Clubs are liable to pay the entry fee for all entries as per their pre-entry to BRC, except in the case of abandonment.

Equine Passports and Microchips - It is your responsibility to ensure that your horse has up to date influenza vaccinations in line with rule G7 in the current BRC Handbook. Horses and ponies cannot be vaccinated within the six days prior to the competition. There is a checking device on the BRC website. If you are unsure, please call BRC on 02476 840518. As of 1st October 2020 it is compulsory for all horses to be microchipped. It is the rider's responsibility to ensure the horse is chipped and it is traceable.

Numbers to qualify as per Appendix 10 in the current BRC Handbook.

All Classes will be in drawn order. Competition will start at approximately 9 am.

Please note all Championship Invitations are issued by BRC Head Office, as all results require to be verified.

<u>Club Representative / Team Manager</u> - Each Club should nominate a Representative / Team Manager to co-ordinate entries, passports, declaration sheets, number collection, etc.

FOR AREA QUALIFIERS - All pre-entries (Team and Individual) must be made online through your Riding Club Representative / Team Manager to BRC HQ no later than <u>21st June 2025</u>. BRC HQ Pre-entry fees: **£48 per Team / £12.50 per individual**. ALL team members are automatically entered into the individual competition.

Open (non-qualifier entries) may be made direct by the rider (no pre-entry fees payable for these classes).

Ensure that names of riders and horses/ponies are correct at time of entry. Horse/Pony name MUST be as per passport. Microchip numbers MUST be supplied at time of entry. If we have to contact you for missing or incorrect information there will be a £5 admin fee for each item.

Successful entries will receive two confirmation e-mails - one from TicketTailor and one from PayPal.

<u>Club Helpers</u> - Each Club should provide one NON RIDING helper per team entered (and/or one helper per 4 individuals). Helper/Volunteer information MUST be completed online at time of entry. Helpers will be allocated a morning or afternoon session. An e-mail with details of volunteer duties will be sent to the club contact (person who makes the entries) after times are published.

Volunteer information must be provided at time of final entries. Any Clubs that do not provide named non-riding helpers plus contact details in advance will have one member disqualified per missing helper. Please note that the helpers are still required even if team or individuals withdraw.

ANY changes to horse and/or rider after the times are published will incur a £5 fee per change.
